1. Contractors who fulfil the following requirements shall be eligible to apply.
Joint ventures/consortia and special-purpose vehicles are not acceptable.

[1(b), 1(c) & 1(d) are not applicable for CPWD enlisted contractors of appropriate class. 1(a)(i) and 1(e) and 1(f) are applicable for CPWD enlisted contractors also].

- a) Should have satisfactorily completed the works as mentioned below during the last seven years ending on the last day of the month previous to the one in which tenders are invited. (For this purpose, the cost of work shall mean the gross value of the completed work, including the cost of materials supplied by the Government/ client but excluding those supplied free of cost. This should be certified by an officer not below the rank of Project Manager/ Executive Engineer & Senior Manager or Equivalent.)
- (i) Three similar completed works, each costing not less than Rs. 34.04 Cr.
or
Two similar completed works, each costing not less than Rs. 51.06 Cr.
or
One similar completed work costing not less than Rs. 68.08 Cr.

“Similar works” shall mean works of:

“Construction of precast RCC building designed as either beam- column system or wall panel-slab system, including internal and external water supply, sanitary installations, drainage, internal electrical installations, etc., all composite executed under one agreement in India. Godowns or Warehouses or factory sheds or industrial structure shall not be considered as eligible similar works”.

The value of executed works shall be brought to the current costing level by enhancing the actual value of work at a simple rate of 7% per annum, calculated from the date of completion to the previous day of the last date of submission of tenders.

NOTE:-

Qualified similar works may be physically inspected by the IISER to ascertain the completion, performance, and quality of works for finalising the technical bid.

- (b) Should have had an Average Annual Financial Turnover of Rs. 25.53 Cr. on construction works during the immediate last three consecutive financial years ending 31st March 2025. (*Scanned copy of Certificate from Chartered Accountant with Unique Document Identification Number (UDIN) to be uploaded*). The value of annual turnover figures shall be brought to the current value by enhancing the actual turnover figure at a simple rate of 7% per annum.

- (c) Should not have incurred any loss (profit after tax should be positive) in more than two years during the last five consecutive balance sheets (Standalone financial Statement, duly audited and certified by a Chartered Accountant) ending 31st March 2025.
- (d) Should have a Banker's Certificate from a commercial Bank for Rs. 34.04 Cr. (40% of ECPT) certified by his bankers (Scanned copy of original Bankers Certificate to be uploaded on the format prescribed in the Form "B" given in this NIT).
or
Net Worth Certificate of minimum Rs. 8.51 Cr. (10% of ECPT) from a Chartered Accountant with Unique Document Identification Number (UDIN) (Scanned copy of original Net Worth Certificate to be uploaded on the format prescribed in the Form "B-1" given in this NIT).
- (e) **Bidding Capacity:**
- i) Should have bidding capacity equal to or more than the estimated cost of the work put to tender. The bidding capacity shall be worked out by the following formula:

A	Maximum turnover in construction works executed in any one year during the last seven years, taking into account the completed as well as works in progress. The value of completed works shall be brought to the current costing level by enhancing at a simple rate of 7% per annum.

B	Value of existing commitments of ongoing works during the period of completion of work for which bids have been invited.

Notes:

- The bidder should submit bidding capacity as per **Form'C-3'**.
- Bidding capacity formula for CPWD contractors who are enlisted based on rule 6.1.7 of Enlistment Rules-2024, i.e., government retired engineer/ architect for three years from the date of issue of the enlistment order, is as follows:

Bidding Capacity	$[(AxN \times 1.5) - B]$,
A	Banker certificate figure as submitted by the applicant (i.e., government retired engineer/architect) at the time of enlistment for the first year of enlistment, and a subsequent fresh banker's certificate for the second and third years, respectively. Value of A for the first year will be mentioned in the enlistment order by the member secretary of the advisory committee for the enlisting authority.
N	Number of years prescribed for completion of work for which bids have been invited.

B	Value of existing commitments of ongoing works during the period of completion of work for which bids have been invited.
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Within three years from the date of issuance of the enlistment order, the newly enlisted entity must develop its own bidding capacity, and thereafter, the general bidding capacity formula used for other entities shall apply to it for the calculation of bidding capacity.

A newly enlisted entity may choose to follow the general bidding capacity formula even before the three years if it chooses.

- Bidding capacity, for CPWD contractors who are enlisted based on Rules 9.6.3 & 9.6.4 of Enlistment Rules, i.e., a new entity based on a previously enlisted entity for three years from the date of issue of the enlistment order, is as follows:

Annual turnover of the newly enlisted entity shall be in proportion to the shareholding of partners/directors in the original enlisted entity at the time of enlistment of the newly enlisted entity.

Within three years from the date of issuance of the enlistment order, the newly enlisted entity must develop its own bidding capacity, and thereafter, the general bidding capacity formula used for other entities shall apply to it for the calculation of bidding capacity. A newly enlisted entity may choose to follow the general bidding capacity formula even before the three years, if it so chooses.

Bidding Capacity for newly enlisted entity based on rules 9.6.3 & 9.6.4 Enlistment Rules shall be as follows: -

A'	Proportionate share of newly enlisted director/partner in the originally enlisted company/firm multiplied by factor A, as given below. Value of A' will be mentioned in the enlistment order by the member secretary of the Advisory committee for Enlistment Authority; it will remain the same for three years.
A	Maximum turnover in construction works executed in any one year during the last seven years, taking into account the completed as well as works in progress. The value of completed works shall be brought to the current costing level by enhancing at a simple rate of 7% per annum. This value is of the originally enlisted entity at the time of enlistment of the newly enlisted entity.
N	Number of years prescribed for completion of work for which bids have been invited.
B	Value of existing commitments of ongoing works during the period of completion of work for which bids have been invited.

Enlisted entities based on rules 6.1.7, 9.6.3, or 9.6.4 of Enlistment Rules can submit a MoU from an agency having the requisite experience for structural system technology if the enlisted entity does not have the required experience.

(f) **Applicable for both CPWD and Non-CPWD contractors.**

For specialised components of Civil and E & M works, the main contractor is required to associate with specialised agencies that have experience of satisfactorily completing similar works as mentioned in the bid document during the last 7 (seven) years. The value of executed works shall be brought to the current costing level by enhancing the actual value of work at a simple rate of 7% per annum, calculated from the date of completion to the previous day of the last day of submission of bids. The bidder should either meet the eligibility conditions as mentioned in the table below, or, if not, they will have to associate with an agency that meets the eligibility requirements for specialised work. The bidder shall submit details of such agency(s) as given below to the Executive Engineer of the component concerned at least one month in advance of the date of taking up the execution of the specified component.

Note :

1. The MOU/association agreement for the specialised components of civil and E&M works is to be submitted only by the successful L1 bidder.
2. The intending bidder must read the terms and conditions of CPWD-6 carefully. He should only submit his bid if he considers himself eligible and he is in possession of all the required documents.
3. The information and instructions for bidders posted on the website shall form part of the bid document.
4. The bid document, consisting of Conceptual Architectural Plans / Drawings, Specifications, Schedule

of quantities of various types of items to be executed, and the set of terms and conditions of the contract to be complied with, and other necessary documents, can be seen and downloaded from <https://eprocure.gov.in/eprocure/app> & www.iiserb.ac.in free of cost.

5. The EMD of **Rs. 95,09,903/-** by bank transfer (I-Collect) (Tenderers may visit: <https://onlinesbi.sbi.bank.in/sbicollect/collecthome.htm> if any assistance is required) shall be deposited by all the intending bidders within the time and date of submission as mentioned in 'Information and Instructions for Bidders for e-tendering' of NIT, failing which the bids shall be rejected and uploaded documents shall not be verified. **(Being a work contract, no exemption is allowed to any MSME / NSIC registered bidders)**

A portion of the earnest money may also be accepted in the form of a Bank Guarantee. In such a case, 50% of earnest money or Rs. 20.00 Lakh, whichever is less, will have to be deposited in the shape prescribed above and balance can be accepted in form of a Bank Guarantee issued by a Scheduled Commercial Bank having validity for Six months or more from the last date of receipt of bids, which is to be scanned and uploaded by the intending bidders.

The Earnest money given by all the tenderers except the lowest tenderer shall be refunded immediately after the expiry of the stipulated bid validity period or immediately after acceptance of the successful bidder, whichever is earlier.

However, in case of a two / three bid system, earnest money deposit of bidders who are unsuccessful during technical bid evaluation, etc., shall be returned within 30 days of the declaration of the result of the technical bid evaluation.

Copies of the work experience certificate and other documents, as specified in the press notice, shall be scanned and uploaded to the e-Tendering website. Certified copies of the same documents shall be submitted in person by all bidders to the office of the Superintending Engineer, IWD, on the date of opening of the technical bid.

Online bid documents submitted by intending bidders shall be opened only for those bidders whose proof of EMD has been deposited and other documents scanned and uploaded are received by the prescribed time and date, and found in order.

6. The intending bidder must have a valid class-III digital signature certificate with encryption key (combo type) to perform any operations/ transactions on the e- tendering portal/website, and the bidder should download as per the instructions available on the download section of <https://eprocure.gov.in/eprocure/app>
7. Every page of the documents submitted by the applicant/firm shall be numbered & bear the stamped and full signature of the legally authorised person of the firm. Authority letters duly notarised are to be submitted along with the tender documents.
8. On the opening date, the contractor can log in and see the bid opening process. After opening the bids, he will receive the competitor's bid sheets.
9. Contractor can upload documents in the form of JPG and PDF formats.
10. Certificate of Financial Turnover: At the time of submission of bid, the contractor may upload a n Affidavit/Certificate from a chartered accountant mentioning the Financial Turnover of the last seven (7) years or for the period as specified in the bid document, and further details, if required, may be asked from the contractor after opening of technical bids. There is no need to upload the entire voluminous balance sheet.
11. The Technical Bid shall be opened first on the due date and time as mentioned above. The time and date of opening of the financial bid of contractors qualifying the technical bid shall be communicated to them at a later date.
12. Pre-Bid conference shall be held with the intending bidders by the Superintending Engineer, IWD conference room, IISER Bhopal-462066 at 11.00 Hrs. on 04/05/2026 to clear the doubt of intending Bidders, if any. Bidders should send all their queries by email to the Superintending Engineer, IWD, Bhopal (Tel. No. 0755-2692350 / 2355, e-mail address: seiwd@iiserb.ac.in) latest by 11:00 hrs. on 04/05/2026.
13. When bids are invited in a three-stage system, and if it is desired to submit the revised financial bid, then it shall be mandatory for the bidder to submit the revised financial bid. If not submitted, then the bid submitted by him earlier shall become invalid.
14. The Institute reserves the right to reject any prospective application without assigning any reason and to restrict the list of qualified contractors to any number deemed suitable by it, if too many bids are received satisfying the laid down criterion.
15. The Bidder shall compulsorily submit the letter of transmittal (Appendix A1), duly filled, signed, and sealed.
16. Contractor shall not divert any advance payments or part thereof for any other purpose other than needed for completion of the contracted work. All advance payments received as per terms of the contract (i.e. mobilization, secured advance against materials brought at site, secured advance against plant & machinery and/or for work done during interim stages, etc.) are required to be re-invested in the contracted work to ensure timely availability of resources in terms of materials, labour, plant & machinery needed for required pace of progress for timely completion of work.
17. Intending bidders are advised to inspect and examine the site and its surroundings and satisfy themselves before submitting their tenders as to the nature of the ground and sub- soil (so far as is practicable), the form and nature of the site, the means of access to the site, the accommodation they may require and in general shall themselves obtain all necessary information as to risks, contingencies and other circumstances which may influence or affect their tender. A tenderer shall be deemed to have full knowledge of the site, whether he inspects

it or not, and no extra charge consequent upon any misunderstanding or otherwise shall be allowed. The tenderer shall be responsible for arranging and maintaining at his own cost all materials, tools & plants, water, electricity access, facilities for workers, and all other services required for executing the work unless otherwise specifically provided for in the contract documents.
